Handling Procedures

- 1. Open thawed vial.
- 2. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #416 broth.



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- Additional test tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary broth tubes.
- 3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #416 plate and/or #416 agar slant.
- 4. Incubate at 37°C for 24-48 hours in an atmosphere of 5% CO₂.

Notes

Growth is generally best in broth or on biphasic slants and may be poor on agar plates and slants.

This item also grows better on Sheep Blood agar plates.
