Vibrio harveyi strain 116B is an aerobic bacterium that was isolated from the kidney of a brown shark.

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Medium:

ATCC Medium 2: Marine agar 2216 or marine broth 2216

Temperature: 26°C

Atmosphere: Aerobic

Handling Procedures

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. From a single tube of the recommended broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette and use to rehydrate the pellet.

3. Aseptically transfer the rehydrated pellet back into the broth tube. Mix well.
 4. Use several drops of this suspension to inoculate an additional broth tube, an agar slant and/or a plate.
 5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 26°C for 48 hours.
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Notes

Colonies are straw-colored, irregular, translucent, flat, glistening, and spreading.
