For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

#### **Growth Conditions**

Medium: ATCC Medium 3: Nutrient agar or nutrient broth Temperature: 30°C Atmosphere: Aerobic

#### Handling Procedures

- 1. Open vial.
- 2. Using a single tube of #3 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the pellet.
- 3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.

- 4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #3 slant, and/or plate
- 5. Incubate all tubes and plate at 30°C for 24 to 48 hours.

#### Notes

Two colony types may be found. The larger type is entire, glistening, and translucent with a slightly undulating edge. The smaller colony appears entire, smooth, glistening and translucent. On a wet mount the organisms can be seen as singles, pairs and short chains.
