For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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### **Handling Procedures**

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions or visit [www.atcc.org](http://www.atcc.org) for instructions.
2. Rehydrate the entire pellet with approximately 0.5 mL of #18 broth. Aseptically transfer the entire contents to a 5-6 mL tube of #18 broth. Additional test

tubes can be inoculated by transferring 0.5 mL of the primary broth tube to these secondary tubes.

3. Use several drops of the primary broth tube to inoculate a #18 plate and/or #18 agar slant.
4. Incubate at 26°C for 48-72 hours.

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### **Notes**

If cells are allowed to incubate for more than 72 hours, they will continue to grow showing changes in size and attain a reddish-brown color.
