For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

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### **Growth Conditions**

**Medium:**

ATCC Medium 2: Marine agar 2216 or marine broth 2216

**Temperature:** 30°C

**Atmosphere:** Aerobic

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### **Handling Procedures**

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #2 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #2 agar slant and/or plate.

5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 30°C for 48 hours.

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## Notes

On #2 plates, colonies are circular, slightly raised and have a yellow pigment. After 48 hours the colonies begin to degrade the agar.
