Adult Melanocyte Growth Kit contains components that when added to Dermal Cell Basal Medium (ATCC PCS-200-030) create a complete ATCC Primary Cell Solutions culture environment for melanocytes derived from a normal adult human epidermis (eg, Primary Epidermal Melanocytes; Normal, Human, Adult, ATCC PCS-200-013). # Handling Procedures

#### **Unpacking and Storage Instructions**

- 1. Check all containers for leakage or breakage.
- 2. Store the growth kit(s) at either -20°C in a freezer that is not self-defrosting or at -70°C for long-term storage. If thawed upon arrival, the Growth Kit can be stored at 2°C to 8°C and added to the basal medium within 72 hours of receipt.

#### **Preparation of Complete Growth Media**

- 1. Obtain one growth kit from the freezer; make sure that the caps of all components are tight.
- 2. Thaw the components of the growth kit just prior to adding them to the basal medium.
- 3. Obtain one bottle of Dermal Cell Basal Medium (485 mL) from cold storage.
- 4. Decontaminate the external surfaces of all growth kit component vials and the basal medium bottle by spraying them with 70% ethanol.
- 5. Using aseptic technique and working in a laminar flow hood or biosafety cabinet, transfer the indicated volume of each growth kit component, as indicated in Table 1, to the bottle of basal medium using a separate sterile pipette for each transfer.

Calcium Chloride	840 µL	1.5 mM
M8 Supplement	5 mL	Proprietary formulation

Antimicrobials and phenol red are not required for proliferation, but may be added if desired. The recommended volume of each **optional** component to be added to the complete growth media is summarized in Table 2.

 Table 2. Addition of Antimicrobials/Antimycotics and Phenol Red (Optional)

Component	Volume	Final Concentration
Gentamicin- Amphotericin B Solution	0.5 mL	Gentamicin: 10 μg/mL Amphotericin B: 0.25 μg/mL
Penicillin- Streptomycin- Amphotericin B Solution	0.5 mL	Penicillin: 10 Units/mL Streptomycin: 10 µg/mL

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		Amphotericin B: 25 ng/mL
Phenol Red	0.5 mL	33 µM

- 6. Tightly cap the bottle of complete growth medium and swirl the contents gently to assure a homogeneous solution. Do not shake forcefully to avoid foaming. Label and date the bottle.
- 7. Complete media should be stored in the dark at 2°C to 8°C (do not freeze). When stored under these conditions, complete media is stable for 30 days.

#### Notes

- 1. Obtain one growth kit from the freezer; make sure that the caps of all components are tight.
- 2. Thaw the components of the growth kit just prior to adding them to the basal medium.
- 3. Obtain one bottle of Dermal Cell Basal Medium (485 mL) from cold storage.
- 4. Decontaminate the external surfaces of all growth kit component vials and the basal medium bottle by spraying them with 70% ethanol.
- 5. Using aseptic technique and working in a laminar flow hood or biosafety cabinet, transfer the indicated volume of each growth kit component, as indicated below, to the bottle of basal medium using a separate sterile pipette for each transfer.



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#### A. Adult Melanocyte Growth Kit Components

- rh Insulin, 0.5 mL (Final concentration 5 μg/mL)
- Ascorbic acid, 0.5 mL (Final concentration 50 μg/mL)
- L-Glutamine, 15.0 mL (Final concentration 6 mM)
- Epinephrine, 0.5 mL (Final concentration 1.0 μM)
- Calcium Chloride 840 µL (Final concentration 1.5 mM)
- Peptide growth factor, 1 mL (0.2% proprietary formulation)
- M8 supplement, 5 mL (1% proprietary formulation)

Antimicrobials and phenol red are not required for proliferation but may be added if desired. The recommended volume of either of the optional components to be added to the complete growth media is summarized below.

#### B. Addition of Antimicrobials/Antimycotics and Phenol Red (Optional):

- Gentamicin-Amphotericin B Solution, 0.5 mL (Final concentration Gentamicin: 10 μg/mL; Amphoteriicin B: 0.25 μg/mL)
- Penicillin-Streptomycin-Amphotericin B Solution, 0.5 mL (Final concentration Penicillin: 10 Units/mL, Streptomycin: 10 μg/mL, Amphotericin B: 25 ng/mL).
- Phenol Red, 0.5 mL (Final concentration 33 μM)
- 6. Tightly cap the bottle of complete growth medium and swirl the contents gently to assure a homogeneous solution. Do not shake forcefully to avoid foaming. Label and date the bottle.
- 7. Complete growth media should be stored in the dark at 2°C to 8°C (do not freeze). When stored under these conditions, complete growth media is stable for 30 days.
