*Geothermobacter hydrogeniphilus* strain EPR-M is a bacterial type strain that was isolated in 2016 from a semi-extinct vent chimney. This strain is an iron reducer that is propagated anaerobically.

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## Handling Procedures

### Depositor-recommended growth conditions:

DSM medium 1210a with the following modifications: 15 g/L NaCl (instead of 18 g/L), no pH modification of medium (pH 6.0-6.3), no MES or any other organic buffer, anaerobically (80% H<sub>2</sub>, 20% CO<sub>2</sub>), at 40°C for 3-4 days to log ph
