



Human adenovirus 31

VR-3343™

Description

Human adenovirus 31 strain 1315/63 is propagated in KB cells (ATCC CCL-17). This virus was presumably isolated from the feces of a normal child and was adapted for growth in KB cells. This strain cross-reacts with Adenovirus types 12 and 18 and produces tumors in newborn hamsters.

ATCC highly recommends that appropriate personal protective equipment is always used when handling vials. For cultures that require storage in liquid nitrogen, it is important to note that some vials may leak when submersed in liquid nitrogen and will slowly fill with liquid nitrogen. Upon thawing, the conversion of the liquid nitrogen back to its gas phase may result in the vial exploding or blowing off its cap with dangerous force creating flying debris. Unless necessary, ATCC recommends that these cultures be stored in the vapor phase of liquid nitrogen rather than submersed in liquid nitrogen.

Growth Conditions

Effects: CPE; cell rounding; cell sloughing

Complete medium: EMEM (ATCC 30-2003) + 2% FBS (ATCC 30-2020)

Temperature: 37°C

Recommendations for infection: Plate cells 16-24 hours prior to infection and infect when cultures are 70-80% confluent. Remove medium and inoculate with a small volume of virus (eg, 1 mL per 25 cm²) diluted to provide an optimal MOI (eg, 0.02). Adsorb 1-2 hours at 37°C in a humidified 5% CO₂ atmosphere. End adsorption by adding virus growth medium.

Incubation: 5-7 days at 37°C in a humidified 5% CO₂ atmosphere, until CPE is progressed through 80% of the monolayer.

Derived by adaptation of ATCC VR-1109 to KB cells (ATCC CCL-17). ATCC VR-1109 and ATCC VR-3343 have not been compared for sequence or infectivity in primary cell culture and tissue culture.

Cross-reacts with Adenovirus types 12 and 18 and produces tumors in newborn hamsters.
