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## Description

## Propagation

### Medium

ATCC® Medium 416: Lactobacilli MRS Agar/Broth

### Growth Conditions

**Temperature:** 37.0°C

### Propagation Procedure

1. Open vial according to enclosed instructions.
2. Using a single tube of #416 broth (5 to 6 ml), withdraw approximately 0.5 to 1.0 ml with a Pasteur or 1.0 ml pipette. Rehydrate the entire pellet.
3. Aseptically transfer this aliquot back into the broth tube. Mix well.
4. Use several drops of the suspension to inoculate a #416 agar slant and/or plate.
5. Incubate the tubes and plate at 37°C in an atmosphere of 5% CO<sub>2</sub> for 24 to 48 hours.

## Notes

Colonies on #416 agar are pinpoint, irregular, entire, low convex, translucent and vary in size.

Broth may be turbid at 24 hours. Because of the rapid growth in broth, it is advisable to transfer to fresh media at 24 hours to maintain viability. Growth is best in broth or biphasic slants.
